

Regulation No. (9) for the Year 2001
Regulation for Customs for the Aqaba Special Economic Zone

**Issued in accordance with Paragraph (B) of Article (29) and Article (56) of the
Aqaba Special Economic Zone Law No. (32) for the Year 2000**

Article (1)

This Regulation shall be known as the (Regulation for Customs for the Aqaba Special Economic Zone for the Year 2001) and shall come into effect as of the date of its publication in the Official Gazette.

Article (2)

The following words and phrases wherever used in this Regulation shall have the meanings ascribed thereto hereunder unless the context indicates otherwise:

Law	: The Aqaba Special Economic Zone Law.
Zone	: The Aqaba Special Economic Zone.
Authority	: The Authority of the Zone.
Board	: The Board of Commissioners.
Chief Commissioner	: The Chairman of the Board.
Customs Territory	: The lands and territorial waters of the Kingdom, excluding the Zone.
Customs Premises	: The strip that is defined by the Chief Commissioner for every marine or air port or any other place in which there is a customs office for the Authority in the Zone which is licensed to complete all or part of the customs procedures.
Customs Line	: The line contiguous with the Zone's borders.
Customs Department	: The General Customs Department.
Customs Law	: The enacted Customs Law.
Registered Enterprise	: The person registered with the Authority and licensed to conduct any economic activity in the Zone according to the provisions of the Law.
Enterprise	: The persons obligated to present the Admission, Exit Applications and Statistical Declaration.
Goods	: Every natural material or animal, agricultural or industrial product, including electrical power.
Type of Goods	: The nomenclature stated in the Customs Tariff Table issued in accordance with the provisions of the Customs Law.
Importation	: Admission of goods into the Zone by the Registered Enterprise according to the provisions of the Law and this Regulation.
Exportation	: Exiting goods from the Zone according to the provisions of this Regulation.

- Import and Export Instructions** : The instructions issued in accordance with Subparagraph (2) of Paragraph (B) of Article (29) of the Law.
- Carrier** : The owner of the conveyance or his representative or any Enterprise engaged in the business of transportation of Goods or persons, using any vessel, aircraft, vehicle or other conveyance designed to transport Goods, except a container.
- Container** : The outer container in which goods are kept for transportation purposes.
- Transit** : Movement of Goods and their method of transfer through the Zone by entering the Office of Arrival and exiting from the Office of Exit into the Customs Territory or a foreign country.
- Office of Arrival** : The place designated by the Authority through which persons or Goods enter the Zone.
- Office of Exit** : The place designated by the Authority through which persons or Goods exit the Zone.
- Declaration** : The statement presented to the Authority, which includes the definition of the distinct elements of the Goods declared at the Office of Arrival or Exit.
- Declarant** : The person who prepares the Declaration, or in whose name the Declaration is prepared, and who is entitled to present the Goods to the Authority in order to complete the customs procedures.
- Clearance Agent** : The person stipulated in the Customs Law, who is authorized to perform clearance activities in the Zone.

General Provisions

Article (3)

A- The Authority shall perform its powers within the Zone according to the provisions of the Law and this Regulation.

B- The Goods in the Zone and the admission and exit of such shall be subject to the provisions and procedures stipulated in this Regulation and the instructions issued pursuant thereto.

Article (4)

A- For purposes of implementing the provisions of the Law and this Regulation, the origin of the Goods shall be determined according to the enacted rules and provisions in the Customs Territory.

B- Imported Goods shall be subject to the proof of origin. The conditions for proving the origin and the exemption of such shall be determined in instructions issued by the Board for this purpose.

Article (5)

The bases and provisions stated in the Customs Law and the provisions of the international agreements to which the Kingdom is a party shall apply to the customs value.

Article (6)

A Declaration for Goods that enter or exit the Zone shall be submitted unless this Regulation or any other regulation issued in accordance with the Law provides otherwise.

Article (7)

A- The Board shall issue the Import and Export Instructions to determine the provisions and procedures necessary to regulate the Importation and Exportation processes including:

- 1- Prohibited Goods.
- 2- Goods, the entry of which into the Zone is forbidden.
- 3- Goods, the Importation and Exportation of which is subject to certain approvals and the body issuing such approval.
- 4- Goods the Exportation of which is forbidden or restricted.
- 5- Customs procedures for protecting intellectual property rights.

B- The following shall be taken into consideration when issuing the Import and Export Instructions:

- 1- The Kingdom's commitments in accordance with the trade and economic agreements to which the Kingdom is a party.
- 2- Any arrangements which the Authority concludes with the competent bodies that aim at streamlining the procedures for transporting Goods from the Zone or through the Zone into the Customs Territory.

Article (8)

A- It is forbidden to enter prohibited Goods into the Zone. The Authority must sequester the Goods and dispose of or destroy such according to the provisions of this Regulation.

B- Goods, the entry of which is forbidden, shall be returned to their source and shall not be cleared.

C- No customs transaction may be completed for Goods, the Importation and Exportation of which is subject to certain approval according to the Import and Export Instructions, prior to obtaining such approval.

Article (9)

Subject to any regulation issued in accordance with the Law, the Customs Law and the enacted General Sales Tax Law, including the exemptions and cases pending fees shall apply to vehicles.

Article (10)

A- Goods, of which taxes and duties have been collected in the Customs Territory according to the provisions of the enacted legislation, shall be excluded from the

admission and exit provisions and the statistical Declaration stated in this Regulation. Such duties and taxes may not be remitted.

B- The Board shall adopt a Merchandise Control System in the Zone and upon the Goods entry and exit therefrom.

Article (11)

A- The Authority shall, according to arrangements concluded with the Customs Department, collect bonds not less than the amount of customs duties and fees due in the Customs Territory for the Customs Department's account for any Goods the entry of which is permitted according to the prevailing legislation in the Customs Territory. The admission of such Goods into the Zone shall be deemed an Importation in violation of the Law until the clearance procedures are completed at the Customs Department.

B- The Authority shall also perform the following:

- 1- Collect the fees for any service it renders.
- 2- Store Goods that have been abandoned, left unclaimed, foreclosed, sequestered by the Authority and the forfeited Goods and those awaiting disposition according to the provisions of this Regulation in the places designated by the Authority.
- 3- Destroy, sell or dispose of forfeited or abandoned Goods or keep such for its own use according to the provisions of this Regulation.

Article (12)

It is prohibited for ships, irrespective of their tonnage, to dock in other than the port prepared for receiving it, except in an urgent marine circumstance or *in force majeure*. In this event, the ships' master must inform without delay the closest office of the Authority or police station of such.

Article (13)

It is prohibited for airplanes to take off or land in other than airports that have customs offices, except *in force majeure*. In this event, the pilot must inform without delay the closest office of the Authority or police station of such.

Article (14)

Goods shall not be jettisoned from a ship or aircraft during sail or flight, except when ordered by the ship's master or pilot when necessary for the safety of the voyage. In such a case, the ship's master or pilot must inform the Authority of such without delay.

Article (15)

It is not allowed to enter or exit the Zone by land except from the Offices of Arrival and Exit.

Article (16)

All Goods entering or exiting the Zone shall be declared, unless provided otherwise by this Regulation or any other regulation issued in accordance with the Law.

Article (17)

Cargo shall be unloaded only at places designated by the Authority. Cargo may not be unloaded or moved from one conveyance to another except according to the conditions specified by the Authority.

Article (18)

A- The ship's master, its representative or shipping agent shall be responsible for any discrepancy in the number of pieces or packages or their contents, or in the quantity of unpacked, bulk or packed Goods, until the receipt of the Goods by the person authorized to receive them or delivery to the storage according to the provisions of this Regulation.

B- The Board shall issue instructions concerning discrepancy percentages for any overage or shortage in bulk, unpacked or packed Goods, as well as the percentage of partial discrepancy due to forces of nature or packages in bad order which cause contents to escape.

Article (19)

A- In the event of a shortage in the number of unloaded pieces or packages than what is recorded in the manifest or if there is a shortage in the bulk, unpacked or packed Goods exceeding the discrepancy percentage specified in accordance with the instructions issued pursuant to this Regulation, the ship's master or agent shall provide justification for such through supporting documentation which confirms that the shortage occurred before arrival of the ship in the regional waters.

B- If it is impossible to present such documentation according to the provisions of the Customs Law, any shortage will be considered to have been illegally admitted into the Customs Territory and the Customs Department is notified of such.

Article (20)

Goods shall be moved and stored at the risk and expense of the carrier until the Authority has authorized the delivery of such according to the provisions of this Regulation. Goods that have not been unloaded from the ship are either sequestered by the ship's master or agent in the place designated by the Authority or transferred to another location approved by the Authority.

Article (21)

A Cargo Movement Permit for Goods subject to admission and exit provisions according to the provisions of this Regulation shall be issued prior to their onward movement to the Customs Department's clearance office or Office of Exit, as the case may be, according to instructions issued by the Board in which it determines the conditions and procedures necessary for such.

Article (22)

The admission, transportation to or from the Zone of mail or postal parcels shall be carried out in accordance with international postal agreements and the instructions issued by the Board relating to such, after coordinating with the Customs Department and the competent postal authorities of the Customs Territory.

ADMISSION OF GOODS INTO THE ZONE

Article (23)

- A- The following shall be exempt from submitting an application for admission into the Zone for Goods that are subject to the admission and exit provisions according to the provisions of this Regulation:
- 1) currency; checks, bank drafts, money orders, and similar kinds of negotiable instruments; and stamps;
 - 2) business records, whether recorded on paper documents, magnetic discs or tapes, or any other medium;
 - 3) vessels, aircrafts, trailers, or containers whether empty or containing persons or goods, when engaged in the business of transporting goods or persons into the Zone, except vehicles;
 - 4) personal and household effects arriving with or to residents and Zone foreign workers and those accompanying arrivals according to the provisions of the Law and the instructions issued by the Council of Ministers in accordance therewith upon their arrival in the Zone, without reservation to the Authority's right to require an oral or written Declaration of such Goods;
 - 5) commercial imports for the Registered Enterprise, the value of which is less than what is prescribed by the Board;
 - 6) non-commercial imports of the Enterprise according to what is prescribed by the Board.
 - 7) goods in transit for Exportation or exit purposes, as the case may be.

- B- Such Goods shall be released to the Enterprise, resident or other party having the right to admission upon presentation of a commercial invoice, bill of lading, declaration or other document as prescribed in this Regulation or as prescribed by the Authority.

Article (24)

- A- Subject to the provisions of Article (23) of this Regulation, Goods shall be admitted to the Zone pursuant to the Application for Admission made by or on behalf of the Enterprise which is the owner or purchaser of the commercial Goods, provided that the name stated on such conforms with the name shown on the bill of lading, transit document, Cargo Movement Permit or similar transportation document, or the person to whom the ownership of such Goods is transferred.
- B- Instructions shall prescribe the forms for the statements and information to be recorded therein and the documents to be attached thereto and other provisions, procedures and terms related to the admission of Goods into the Zone and the post auditing thereof.

Article (25)

- A- The Authority shall be entitled to examine and inspect Goods and to verify the content of containers at the risk and expense of the Enterprise or its agent, provided that the inspection is conducted at the port or at the premises of the Enterprise in the Zone.
- B- For purposes of streamlining the procedures, the Authority may disregard the examination and inspection procedures and shall be satisfied with accepting the

Declaration for purposes of immediate clearance according to the provisions and conditions prescribed by the Board in instructions issued for this purpose.

Article (26)

- A- When the Authority has decided not to conduct a detailed review or examination of the Goods, or the detailed review or examination has disclosed no violations, the Authority shall authorize the release of the Goods for delivery to the Enterprise. Delivery shall be the responsibility of the Enterprise.
- B- An authorized official or agent of the Enterprise shall sign the Application for Admission of the Goods, and the Enterprise shall be liable for any discrepancy in the condition and quantity of the Goods from that recorded on the Application for Admission. If a discrepancy cannot be justified to the satisfaction of the Authority, any shortage will be treated according to the provisions of Paragraph (B) of Article (25) of the Law.
- C- The Enterprise shall be responsible for filing a new Application for Admission for any excess Goods. In the event that such Application is not submitted and the existence of an overage more than what was declared becomes evident, the overage will be treated according to the provisions of Paragraph (B) of Article (25) of the Law.

Article (27)

- A- The following Goods shall be treated as unclaimed:
 - 1) Goods for which no Application for Admission or other similar document has been submitted to the Authority within twenty one (21) working days of the arrival of the Goods in the Zone.
 - 2) Goods for which a Cargo Movement Permit or other similar document has been authorized by the Authority, but which has not been collected by a Carrier within five (5) working days of the arrival of the Goods in the Zone.
- B- Goods stipulated in Paragraph (A) of this Article shall be moved to the Authority's warehouses at the carrier's or its agent's risk and expense. The Goods shall be admitted into the Authority's warehouses pursuant to receipt minutes signed by the competent official at the Authority, relieving the carrier of responsibility for the Goods, which will thereafter be held at the risk and expense of the consignee.

REMOVAL OF GOODS FROM THE ZONE

Article (28)

Goods may be exited to vessels and aircrafts arriving in the Zone as supplies, equipment, or repair or replacement materials. Such Goods will be treated as exported upon the signature of the Carrier or exporter for lading as supplies, equipment, replacement, or repair materials. The term supplies shall be understood to include fuel, Goods for sale on board the vessel or aircraft, and food and beverages for passengers and crew.

Article (29)

A- The Enterprise shall be accountable for Goods subject to the admission and exit provisions until they are removed from the Zone or disposed of according to the provisions of this Regulation. Goods that have been removed from the Enterprise's premises, but which are missing or cannot be accounted for during their removal from the Zone, shall be presumed to have been admitted into the Customs Territory and shall be treated according to the provisions of Paragraph (B) of Article (25) of the Law.

B- The Enterprise shall take the following actions upon removal of Goods from the Zone:

- 1) check the Goods against the invoices and shipping documentation for verification of their exiting from the Zone and obtaining the signature of the exporter or Carrier on such;
- 2) affix under the Authority's supervision on any vehicle or container seals required by the Authority or the Customs Department;
- 3) obtain a copy of the Customs Department's customs declaration, or any other evidence of exit, and report any discrepancy to the Authority, according to the provisions of this Regulation;
- 4) record in its inventory control and record keeping system the appropriate notation and file all documentation supporting the exit of the Goods from the Zone.
- 5) record the transaction in the Statistical Declaration.

C- The Enterprise shall perform the following actions upon disposing of the Goods according to the provisions of this Regulation:

- 1) verify that the disposition is recorded in the Enterprise's books and that the invoice carries the buyer's name, address and signature.
- 2) record in its inventory control and record keeping system the appropriate notation and file all documentation supporting the disposition of the Goods from the Zone.
- 3) record the transaction in the Statistical Declaration.

Article (30)

A- The Enterprise, its agent or to whom the ownership of the Goods is transferred shall, when transporting the Goods from the Zone to the Customs Territory, present the Goods to Customs Department's clearance office in the Zone and present the customs declaration according to the provisions of the Customs Law, and receive a notice from that office after completing the clearance procedures and before proceeding to the Office of Exit.

B- The Enterprise, transporting Goods from the Zone abroad from other than the Offices of Exit at the borderline with the Customs Territory, shall present to the Authority a Statistical Declaration of the Goods.

Article (31)

- A- The Carrier shall transport the Goods directly to the Office of Exit along a transit corridor prescribed by the Authority and within the maximum time limits prescribed by it. Any deviation from the corridor or exceeding the maximum time limit shall be immediately reported to the Authority, subject to legal liability.
- B- The seal specified by the Authority shall be affixed on the vehicles transporting Goods through the Zone. The Authority shall specify in instructions issued for this purpose the form of the seal, the equipment necessary for conveyances, the method of transportation within the Zone and other provisions

ENTERPRISE'S OBLIGATIONS

Article (32)

The Enterprise shall prepare a Statistical Declaration, accompanied by the required documents according to the provisions of this Regulation or any pertinent regulation issued in accordance with the Law, which shall include the following:

- A- Goods manufactured in the Zone.
- B- Goods admitted into the Zone.
- C- Goods exited into the Customs Territory.
- D- Goods exited to a foreign country.
- E- Goods disposed of according to the provisions of the Law and this Regulation.
- G- Goods that have been consumed.
- H- Goods that have been destroyed or lost.

Article (33)

The Enterprise obliged to present a Statistical Declaration shall perform the following when discovering a shortage in any Goods in its inventory:

- A- Notifying the Authority in writing of such within (5) working days.
- B- Preparing a declaration for introducing the Goods for consumption and presenting such to the Customs Department's customs house according to the provisions of the Customs Law. The Customs Department must notify the Authority of the procedures that are taken pursuant thereto.
- C- Paying the duties, taxes and fines due to the Customs Department according to the provisions of Paragraph (B) of Article (25) of the Law and the prevailing legislation in the Customs Territory.
- D- Recording the pertinent release information in the Authority's Statistical Declaration and maintaining the integrity of the Merchandise Control System.

Article (34)

Any discrepancy in the inventory of the Enterprise obliged to present a Statistical Declaration in what actually exists and what is recorded in the Authority's records or in the Statistical Declaration and without being notified by the Enterprise shall be treated as follows:

A- In the event of a shortage, Goods shall be presumed to have been admitted the Customs Territory in violation of the provisions of Paragraph (B) of Article (25) of the Law, unless the Enterprise proves that the shortage was a cause of the following:

- (1) Goods were lost or destroyed by fire or natural process such as evaporation, spillage or absorption, provided that a proper permit is drafted for such.
- (2) Goods were destroyed with the Authority's approval.

B- In the event of an overage, the excess Goods shall be presumed to have been admitted the Customs Territory in violation of the provisions of Paragraph (B) of Article (25) of the Law.

Article (35)

The Enterprise, which has imported Goods into the Zone, may abandon such to the Authority according to the instructions which are specified by the Authority for this purpose. The Enterprise shall be relieved from the responsibility for these Goods when the Authority approves the abandonment.

Article (36)

All persons entering the Zone shall declare to the Authority all Goods in their possession and of which customs duties and taxes in the Customs Territory have not been collected.

CUSTOMS VIOLATIONS

Article (37)

The following shall be considered a violation of the provisions of Article (54) of the Law:

- a) Admitting, exiting, possessing or transporting any prohibited Goods or which Importation is forbidden.
- b) Obstructing the duties of the Authority's officials according to the provisions of this Regulation and their right to search, audit and inspect, and failing to stop upon the Authority's officials request.
- c) Taking a route other than the transit route designated by the Authority.
- d) Removing the customs seals or buttons from goods consigned by transit or prepared for re-export.
- e) The Carrier's and Enterprise's failing to maintain the records and files required pursuant to the provisions of this Regulation.
- f) The persons' and Enterprise's non-compliance with the obligations resulting thereon pursuant to the provisions of this Regulation.

- g) The unavailability of a cargo manifest, or the availability of a manifest which is inconsistent with actual cargo.
- h) Failure to use the routes and methods designated for admission or exit of Goods.
- i) Discovering undeclared Goods in the Office of Arrival in hideouts with the intent of concealment, holes, or spaces that are not usually intended for such Goods.
- j) Disposing of Goods admitted into the Zone under temporary entry status or transit in violation of the provisions of the Law and this Regulation.
- k) Submitting false, forged or fabricated documents or invoices, or putting false marks on goods with the intent of importing or exporting prohibited, forbidden or restricted Goods or in violation of the provisions of the Law and this Regulation.
- l) Loading and unloading Goods to and from trains, inconsistently with regulations, in places with no Customs Offices.
- m) Unloading or loading the Goods without prior permission from the Authority, or unloading or loading at locations other than the ones designated by the Authority or at a location other than the Offices of Arrival and Exit designated by the Customs Department or the Authority.
- n) Transferring goods from the loading or arrival location prior to obtaining the release permit from the Authority.

Article (38)

- A- The Board may establish a committee known as (the Objections Committee), comprising three members, at least two members from the Authority's officials and one from the specialists and expertise in the private sector.
- B- The Committee shall be responsible for reviewing the objections submitted by Enterprises and persons on the Authority's decisions issued in accordance with the provisions of this Regulation and any violation committed of its provisions. The Committee shall submit its recommendations concerning such to the Chief Commissioner in order to take the decision he deems necessary.
- C- The Board shall issue instructions prescribing the establishment of the committee, nominating its chairman and all the procedures relating thereto.

Article (39)

- A- The Enterprise and residents shall be liable for damages arising from violating the Law or other applicable laws and their implementing regulations, such as the pertinent Customs legislation applicable in the Customs Territory.

B- Any person found committing any offence or violating any provision of the Law, this Regulation or the Customs Law and the regulations issued pursuant thereto shall be liable for any additional costs incurred by the Authority regarding the search, inspection, seizure and disposition of goods relating to the offence or violation.

DISPOSITION OF FORFEITED, ABANDONED AND UNCLAIMED GOODS

Article (40)

A- The Authority shall be authorized to sell, destroy or forfeit any goods that have been abandoned or unclaimed within the Zone as stipulated in Article (43) of this Regulation.

B- Such goods shall be subject to disposition at the following times:

- 1) *Unclaimed goods* - at the end of three months from the date of its receipt by the Authority and storing them into the warehouse according to instructions issued by the Board for this purpose;
- 2) *Abandoned goods* - upon acceptance by the Authority of a written request for abandonment by the Enterprise, resident or other person having the right of abandonment;
- 3) *Forfeiture* - upon order of forfeiture from the court.

Article (41)

A- *Sequestered Goods* - Goods which have not been declared or have been misdescribed or under-valued may be released upon payment of the due fine according to the provisions of the Law, provided that the Goods are not prohibited, forbidden or restricted. Such Goods may be exported under the Authority supervision by the Enterprise, resident or other person from whom they were seized, if:

- 1) the Goods are not required to be held as evidence in any administrative or judicial proceeding of the Authority or any other official body of the Kingdom;
- 2) the Goods may be lawfully exported in accordance with the Customs Territory's legislation or any international convention to which the Kingdom is a party;
- 3) there is little likelihood of their return to the Zone or the Customs Territory.

B- In the event of the Good's forfeiture, such Goods may be transferred to the Authority for use or sale in the Zone, if such use or sale is not in violation of the Law. Otherwise, they shall be destroyed under the Authority's supervision.

C- Goods which have been abandoned may be disposed of by the Authority by transferring such for its own use or sale, or by destruction if their value is less than the costs of sale.

D- The Authority may sell the unclaimed Goods. All costs and charges incurred by the Authority and storage fees and any other proceeds or due taxes shall be

deducted from the proceeds of sale. Any remainder shall be held by the Authority for a year in trust. In the event that the rightful owner does not claim such trust during that period, such trust shall be transferred to the account of the Authority.

Article (42)

Upon transferring to its own use Goods that have been abandoned, left unclaimed, foreclosed, or forfeited to the Authority within the Zone, the Authority shall become accountable for such Goods.

Article (43)

- A- Goods authorized for destruction by the Authority shall be destroyed in accordance with the provisions of this Regulation and under the supervision of the Authority in the Zone, and at its risk and expense. Destruction shall be conducted in a safe and sanitary manner according to the environmental protection legislation in force and shall be complete, leaving no residue of commercial value.
- B- When Goods cannot be completely and safely destroyed in the Zone, the Authority shall, in coordination with the Customs Department, make arrangements for its destruction in specialized facilities in the Customs Territory or a foreign country.

FINAL PROVISIONS

Article (44)

- A- The Authority may foreclose any prohibited Goods, those who have been declared under a disvalue or misdescription, those which have not been declared or smuggled and Goods subject to the provisions of Paragraph (B) of Article (25) of the Law.
- B- The Authority shall be entitled to subsequently search, inspect and audit the Enterprise's inventory and records.

Article (45)

- A- Anyone performing official duties in implementation of this Regulation shall consider all documents, information, statements, production and manufacturing techniques and any other information relating to this Regulation or the implementation of its provisions confidential and shall treat such information accordingly.
- B- The Authority shall exchange information with ministries, governmental departments and public institutions for purposes of implementing the provisions of this Regulation and shall be entitled to request any documents therewith.

Article (46)

The Authority, in coordination with the pertinent bodies especially the Customs Department, shall establish the arrangements necessary for implementing the provisions of this Regulation.

Article (47)

A- The Board shall issue the instructions necessary for implementing the provisions of this Regulation, including the following:

- 1- Procedures for operation of judicial officers for purposes of implementing the provisions of the Law and this Regulation.
- 2- Using electronic means in customs procedures.
- 3- Methods for reviewing the records relating to the Goods which persons maintain in the Zone electronically.
- 4- Forms to be presented to the Authority, including the statements and documents to be attached therewith, the contents and periods necessary for submitting such.
- 5- Requirements of the clearance documents and procedures that apply to express consignments admitted to the Zone.
- 6- Provisions and procedures relating to the inventory of Goods and warehouses, the method of administering such, storing and the method of treating waste, industrial residue and scrap and the cases under which destruction is allowed and other detailed provisions.
- 7- Mechanism of declaring Goods accompanying travelers into the Zone, including the form of the written declaration, if found.
- 8- Provisions and procedures relating to the sale of abandoned, unclaimed or forfeited Goods.
- 9- Bases for exempting the Enterprise from the need to comply with the Statistical Declaration, the form of such, the method of recording its statements, the mechanism of providing the Authority with such and the periods related thereto.
- 10- Specifying the persons' place of residency for purposes of implementing the provisions of this Regulation.
- 11- Determining the fees collected by the Authority for the services it renders.

B- The instructions issued in accordance with the provisions of this Regulation shall be published in the Official Gazette.
